From the Pastor

We are often too busy to take time to reflect. I feel like when I stop to dream for several minutes in a day — you know, just to meditate on the happenings of life or ponder a new thought — I am wasting time. "I need to get back to work!", I tell myself. The tyranny of the urgent drives me. It can drive all of us. But worse, it also causes us to miss important moments of God's provision. We miss meeting our Father.

In the life of the church, an installation service can easily turn into another one of those "checked boxes" moments. "Get it done and move on! We have a lot of plates spinning!", we say (or realize we are saying in our actions). Believe me, I have confessed to Janine on numerous occasions in the last couple of weeks with the many plates I have spinning in my life and at the church, that I have continually failed to remember that the installation service is happening this week (Today)! But I want to encourage you, as I am encouraging myself: slow down, savor God's provision, and meet your Father.

Don't let this moment pass without seeing in it how God has provided. Let the service of installation not be about me, but about God. Let it be about contemplating His provision for our church's mission and vision. Let it be a sign that He fulfills promises and carries you through times when seeing is dim and faith has to lead. Put yourself back in your own shoes just two years ago. Not that long ago, eh? What were you thinking? Feeling? Saying? It may feel like an eternity! The emotions. The trials. The questions. The uncertainties. While I don't know your emotions, trials, and questions intimately, I have gone through times like that and I know how it feels to be there.

Let the installation service be the end or beginning of a healing process. Let the service be a time of reconciliation. Let the service be a celebration of God's faithfulness. Let the service be a time to encourage some faithful friends of yours who stuck it out and gave time they didn't have to search the mysteries of God for His vision for First Pres and to search for its next shepherd. Let the service take its course in your heart and in the body of our church. Let it be part of Jesus' work to reform our hearts and minds towards himself.

In the end, we would be wrong to rush through this moment too quickly *and* to believe it was about Aaron White. Instead, take your time. Take in the moment. Take time to celebrate and encourage. Take time to meet your Father. And, take time to dream. I am excited to dream with you!
