Like most kids, I eagerly anticipated Christmas. My parents were epic gift givers. The last gift was always the best, and the race to get there couldn't be faster! One year it was a drafting table, another it was a Super Nintendo, and another it was an electronic drum set. I had it all! I remember the nights after Christmas wondering how long it would take to get to the next Christmas morning... Those 300+ days could not move quick enough!

Don't hear what I am not saying, I was definitely a blessed kid who had a lot -- a pretty wonderful and caring family, and many material things, but I was all wrong.

I found this out in middle school at a youth group retreat. On this retreat, I heard a man named John share how he had done a thing that seemed quite foreign to me — he placed faith in Jesus as his Lord and Savior and received a free gift from God of salvation by grace.

"A gift from God?" I wondered... I didn't know that God gave gifts. I thought He just demanded that I was a good person and to go to church (so boring!). Not a fun guy to me! But the gift He gave also was news to me.

A gift that never gets old, dusty, or forgotten in the pile of next year's gifts?

A gift that is given in spite of the fact that I am such an imperfect gift-receiver?

This was a gift I had never heard of. I thought I had to be a good kid. I thought my good had to outweigh my bad. I thought I had to keep my elbows off the dinner table and eat all my food. I thought that it was upon my efforts — how often I had asked for forgiveness of my sins — how often I had said sorry to God — how many people I prayed for and smiled at, etc. But John said otherwise. It was a gift given in spite of me but for me in particular. It was the best gift ever to be given, because it was truly unearned and would free me from my guilt, shame, stress and anxiety.

Have you heard of this gift before? The Apostle Paul says: For it is by grace that you have been save through faith, not of yourselves, it is a gift from God, not by works so that no one may boast. This gift is offered to all who would receive it.

Now I am a boring adult who doesn't want too much on Christmas mornings. Frankly, I buy what I feel I want or need at or around the time that feeling arises, if the funds are available. The magic of gift-receiving is not exactly there any longer the way it was when I was a kid. However, the blessing of the gift I received in middle school is still as magical in my heart. It is the best gift I ever received! — even better than Mario Cart!

On this Christmas, I want to ask you two questions: First, as John gave me the gift of the good news, are you willing to give someone else such a valuable gift? John put himself aside for a moment to share with some distracted, hormonedriven middle schoolers an honest and transparent story of his need for something outside of himself, and how he found that in Jesus. Are you willing to do the same? Will you be a gift giver?

Secondly, have you received this gift? In spite of the words of Cousin Eddie about the "Jelly of the Month Club", this gift is not simply "the gift that keeps on giving all year." No, this gift keeps giving eternally, and it gives the most specifically in those moments when we feel we least deserving of it.

My prayer for you this Christmas season is for generosity. And I pray that that begins by giving and receiving the good news of the salvation found in Jesus Christ alone.
