### **From the Pastor**

Greetings in Jesus, Our Lord and Savior,

This year the church will beginning significant movement forward in three areas: small groups, vision casting for our campus, and defining and streamlining leadership. Each of these items are strategic ministry initiatives that we will be praying for and acting on in 2019 according to our implementation plan.

A question I have received on several occasions refers to these three priority ministry initiatives, and I hope to clarify briefly how your Session, specifically, will be at work on these items.

In the past, your Session members were very, very busy with committee work. They were what you would call "chairs of standing committees." This model of leadership is a type that is much in line with institution building. There are virtues to this model but also many drawbacks, most notably the fact that your Session members were actually not chairing committees but doing most or all of the work of that said committee.

My desire as part of the Session of FPC is that your Session can return to the biblical norms of an elder of shepherding the congregation. This is call "the shepherding model". The model change of shepherding leads to the question that I have received on a couple of occasions, and I assume is a question some others are curious about: What do elders do if they are not chairing committees?

Simply put, your elders are called to shepherd you all in prayer, teaching the Word of God, and spear -heading a strategic ministry initiative in our 2019 implementation plan.

What is the major benefit of your elders leading a ministry initiative instead of a committee? The major virtue of this change is that each of these ministry initiatives have clear goals and objectives and have deadlines. Of course, we have all faced the *ad nauseam* work of a standing committee: no deadlines, long meetings, and goals that are rather unclear to say the least. Instead, our ministry initiatives (that will change each year as we work our way towards the 5- and 10-year vision God has set for FPC) are clear and objective. These objectives are going to be hard work (so pray for your elders and offer your assistance!) but they are traceable and quantifiable. This means we know exactly what we are hoping and praying for, we know how God has worked in our midst, and we can give Him glory for His work through our ministry.

Another note you should be aware of is stewardship. These initiatives and objectives steward our resources well. Our time and treasure are limited and need budgeted. One example of this is that each of you have only so many hours in the day. Your elders' time is valuable and their shepherding needs structure and accountability so that they can have time with family, time in the community, and time to fellowship with others at FPC. One important step towards this is that we have made each Session meeting two hours in length and guided by our strategic plan. I am a firm believer that content is the enemy of learning/ progress. If we don't get it done today, there is always tomorrow. The most important thing is that we are serving God and serving our neighbor. Your Session wants to set a good model of managing time well, not engaging in "spiritual busy work", and spending each dollar wisely. Goals and objectives enable your Session to shepherd with clear accountability.

So in the end, what's new? Primarily, you have gained a new pastor and six new shepherds who are equipped (and continually learning) to serve God in this village and see the Kingdom expand to the glory of God.

Please pray for your Session and ask questions. We invite your questions and input!

# Living by Faith or Emotions?

Emotions can be misleading. Probably no one issue has caused more people to lack the assurance of a vital relationship with God than a wrong emphasis on feelings. I have had moments of great joy, enthusiasm and spiritual awareness. And I have also felt times of sorrow and disappointment. But I do not depend on these feelings to determine my union with God. My emotions can be very deceiving.

We are to live the Christian life by faith, not emotions. Yes, emotions have a place in your experience, but how you feel does not determine the truth of your life with Christ. Rather, your emotions are a result of your faith and obedience. Our Lord said, "The one who obeys me is the one who loves me; and because he loves me, my Father will love him; and I will too, and I will reveal myself to him." The Book of Romans assures us, "In the gospel a right-eousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: 'The righteous will live by faith.'"

There is a place for emotions in the Christian experience, though you should not seek them nor attempt to recapture them from the past. While you should not ignore the value of legitimate emotions, it is more important to remember that you are to live by faith in God and in His promises- and not by seeking an emotional experience.
