From the Pastor

Greetings, people of God at First Pres, SC.

This week we will have the blessing of involving ourselves in the baptism of two children.

As a congregation we vow to shepherd these children. In fact, on Sunday February 24th, I hope you will vow the following:

- 1) Do you, the members of this congregation, acting for yourselves and in behalf of the whole Body of Christ, assume responsibility with these parents for the spiritual nurture of this child?
- 2) Do you commit yourself to set a godly example before this child, to provide as far as you are able, all that is necessary to the end that this child may one day confess Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord?

In vowing the above things, you promise that you will partner with the parents of the children in order to spiritually nurture those children so that they might one day personally profess Christ. This involves more than lip service, of course. It involves deep and devoted praver. Support of the parents in sickness and in health. Support of children's and youth ministry. And many, many other things. "It takes a village" they say. I say yes, but more richly, it involves the promises, blessings and security inherent to belonging to the people of God and their initiative involvement in each other's lives in order to encourage, exhort and empower, one another in our walks with Jesus.

In the Reformed tradition we do not have "god parents", as such. In fact, you all are

vowing to set an example and provide time, talent and treasure to ensure the salvation of these children. These children are your stewardship entrusted to you by God himself. In short, it does not simply come down to the pastor nor the elder to set the example (though they are included, of course), but you too! Church is not an activity of "sit and get" but of initiative involvement.

As an important implication of the above, baptism is about the family unit. Our society is waging an all out assault on the family unit, its health, its dignity, and its existence. Baptism promises blessing to and God's unbridled care and protection of that unit. Often we see in Scripture the emphasis of a household being baptized and the inclusion of our youngest into the rights and privileges of the people of God. Baptism gives the power for a family to experience health, unity, and prosperity because it is God's partnership-ing "I do" (His sign and seal) to the children and the parents of the children. Baptism is also God's "I do" to the most helpless, powerless, those who cannot speak for themselves; from the youngest to the oldest. It is God's will that is honored and glorified in baptism, not ours nor our words.

So, this Sunday when you watch the baptism of these two boys, remember the significance, benefits and privileges of your baptism and resolve by faith toward new obedience to God's will in your life — this is all much like when you and your spouse attend a wedding and are reminded of your own vows and the obligations and blessings therein.




