From Pastor Aaron



What is your favorite aspect of the coming of Spring? Is it the warming weather? Is it the blooming of early flowers or buds on trees? Is it seeing neighbors walk by your house that you

haven't seen since last Fall? Or is it all of the above? For me, it is a combination of many things. I love Spring and the hope it brings. The new creation of the world around me is refreshing and encouraging. Suddenly I have new energy and a spring in my step (no pun).

2 Cor 5 tells us of a similar new creation; a new creation we will experience this week as we approach Easter. When God sent His Son, Jesus, He was putting His finishing touches on his 'new creation project'. As we heard in the sermon from Luke 21 last week, the day of our Lord, Jesus, is coming as sure as Summer is coming, and all the signs point to His victory over all sin and death.

2 Corinthians 6:16-18 says,

¹⁶ From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. ¹⁸ All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation...

This week as we will have three opportunities to worship with one another that will be capped off by our celebration of God's victory over death on Easter Sunday. First, on Thursday we will worship together on a day of Holy Week called Maundy Thursday. No, I didn't say "Monday Thursday" — that'd be awkward. Maundy Thursday is a worship service where we will observe the Last Supper and who that table is for. The very next day we will worship with our brothers and sisters at the Methodist church on Good Friday. This is generally a somber service as we contemplate the
