Autopilot Is Not A Kingdom Virtue

People so dearly loved by God, grace and peace to you in God from our Father through our Lord Jesus Christ,

James says to us in his epistle the following:

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"— yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that."

Basically, James is saying, "God is God, and you are not. If you believe otherwise, you are boasting."

I find this to be reassuring. God is in control; but how often I attempt to take control from Him!

In many ways, James' words take us back to Jesus in Matthew 6, who bids us to seek God's kingdom first, and to not be anxious; God is in control and will provide.

In ministry or at church, this can be an especially difficult principle to follow. We want to see **x** amount of people at church on Sunday. We want to see **x**

amount of dollars appear in the plate. We want to see **x** amount of conversions and baptisms. We want to see **x** amount of kids at Pioneer Clubs, Jr. High Night, or Fifth



Quarter. But those things are frankly outside of our control. So what can we do? Should we be "couch-potato Calvinists" (or "fatalists" as I call them) that believe everything is predestined anyway, so what use is it to God for me to do anything? Or should we be "Anxious Arminians" who scurry about like Martha and forget our Lord? Neither.

Instead, we should plan by the guidance of the Holy Spirit, diligently do our work, and let God be God.

Bill Bright, the founder of Campus Crusade for Christ, once said, "Successful evangelism is sharing the gospel in the power of the Holy Spirit, and leaving the results up to God." Same can be said for our ministry at FPC.
