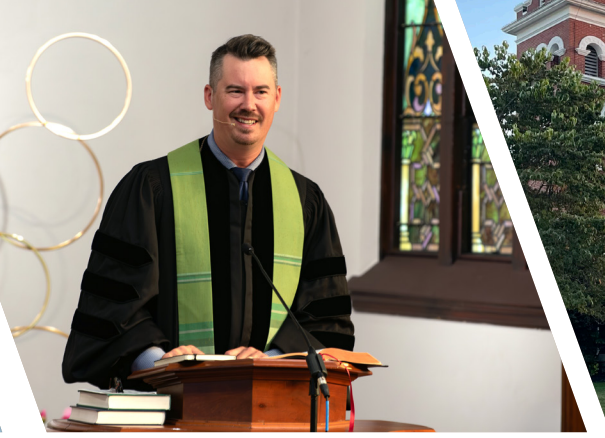

Greetings, people so dearly loved by God; grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

As many of you are aware, we have four core emphases at FPC:



Worship
(gathered prayer, preaching, and the sacraments)



NextGen Ministry



Discipleship
(small groups, discipleship groups, and Sunday school)



Missions

God has called us, as a local church, to pursue these priorities with our time, talents, and treasure. This annual report is one way we tell the story of how God has been at work among us. If a friend ever asks what FPC is all about, I encourage you to share this booklet as an introduction to the life, values, and mission of our church.

This past year has been marked by both faithfulness and renewal. I want to highlight just a few things here, knowing that many more things could receive much praise and gratitude.

One significant milestone was the completion of our daily devotional book, *Growing with the Early Church*, which also shaped our 2024-2025 sermon series. This creation of this project was a true congregational effort. It was a joy to see Scripture, prayer, and shared reflection woven into the daily lives of our church family.

In the fall, we launched a two-year focus called “One Church, One Vision.” This initiative has helped us refocus our shared life around youth and discipleship ministry. Year one centers on the relaunch of junior high ministry and Sunday school. Year two, beginning in the fall of 2026, will focus on relaunching senior high ministry and strengthening our small groups. This is not about programs for their own sake but about forming disciples who know Christ, love His church, and live faithfully in the world.

In August of 2025, we prayed earnestly for the revival of youth in our town—and God responded quickly. Three high school students sought baptism and have since become a regular and committed part of our church body. There has been a passion for the Jr. High ministry that kicked off this fall. Some nights there are nearly 20

students attending Jr. High Group. These are signs of God’s quiet but powerful work among us, and they give us great hope for the future.

Another meaningful change this year was our move to one unified service of worship. Bringing the body of Christ at FPC back together in a single gathering has been a blessing, strengthening our sense of shared identity and community around the Word and Sacrament.

Behind the scenes, the deacons and session have worked diligently to steward our resources wisely. Together, they have focused on rebuilding our “rainy day” fund and ensuring that our financial practices give the congregation confidence and clarity. Their careful stewardship allows us to move forward faithfully, focused on the ministry God has entrusted to us.

As we look ahead, I encourage each of you to prayerfully consider where God may be calling you to offer your time, talent, and treasure. I am especially encouraged by the vitality of our women’s Bible studies and Sunday school discipleship. I also continue to pray that men will step forward to cultivate fellowship, accountability, and growth

together as men in Christ.

Thank you for your faithfulness, your prayers, and your love for Christ and His church. It is a joy to serve alongside you.

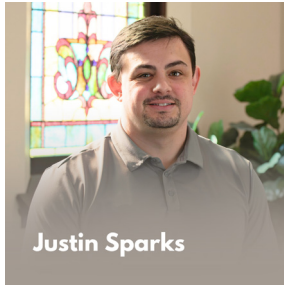

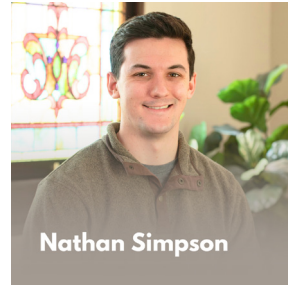

SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT

SUNDAY SCHOOL

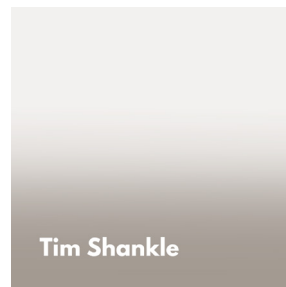

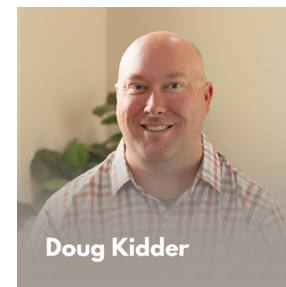

MANNA FOOD PANTRY

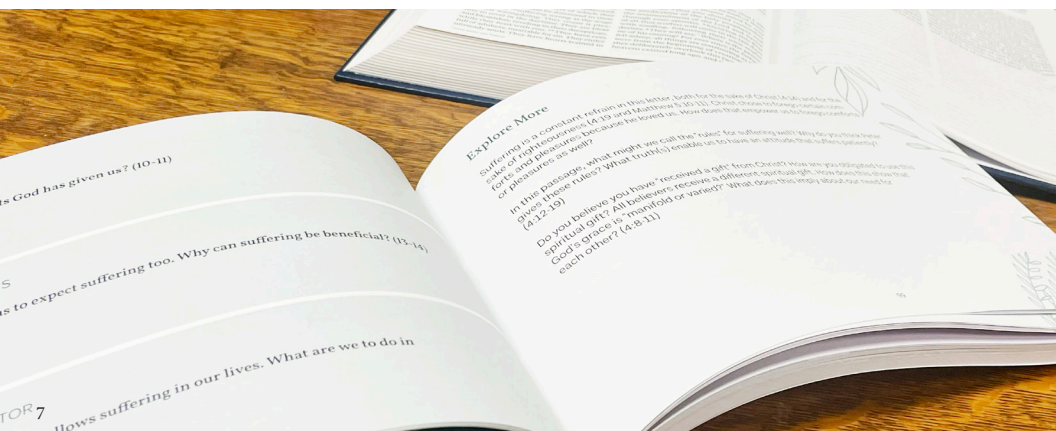
The Manna Food Pantry continues to serve families in the Southeastern School District. There were 25-30 households served in 2025.

Through the Good Samaritan Fund, deacons helped community members with emergency needs for utilities. Christmas food baskets and gifts were also distributed.

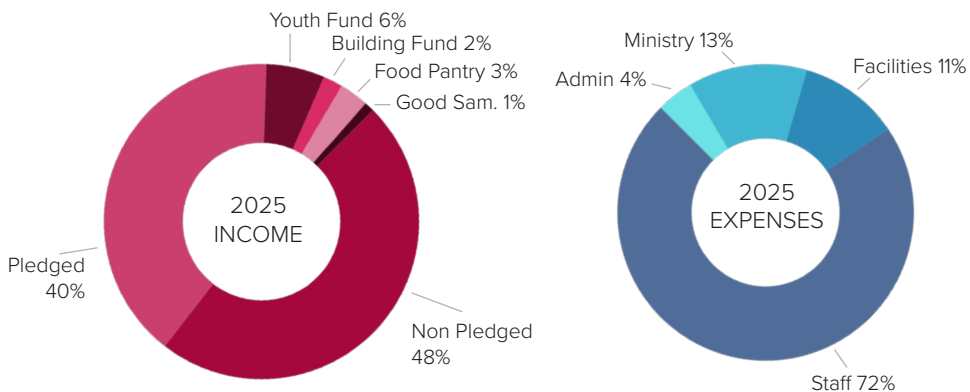
Additionally, the deacons provided Barb Florence with cards and stamps to continue the popular card ministry that blesses many in our community.

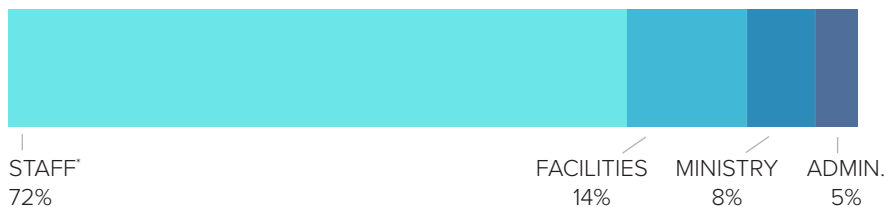

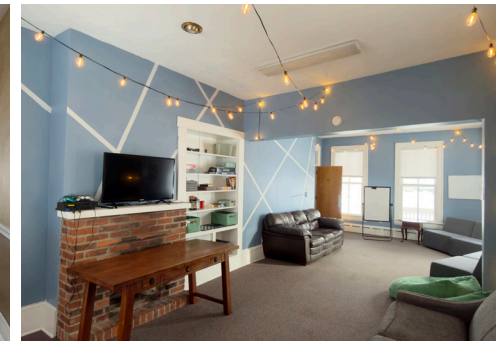
